+ Music Theory I & II should be taken prior to Music History II or higher.

Students should apply for admission to the Music Education Professional Sequence as early as possible. They must achieve admission to the Professional Sequence before beginning the first semester of the junior year. Admission requirements include:

1. Cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.75 or higher.
2. Grade Point Average on Kansas Board of Regents Required Coursework of 2.75 or higher. Must have grades of "C" or better in all 6 hours of Math and 9 hours of Communications/English.
3. Applicants must achieve minimum PPST scores of 173 in reading, 172 in writing, and 172 in mathematics. Computer based PPST scores are acceptable. A copy of your reported scores must be attached.
4. Successful completion of the Application form (typed).
5. Satisfactory faculty evaluations in the areas of Music Education, Music Theory, Ensemble, & Performance Media. A special recommendation form is to be completed by each applicant's applied instructor.
