## Programs

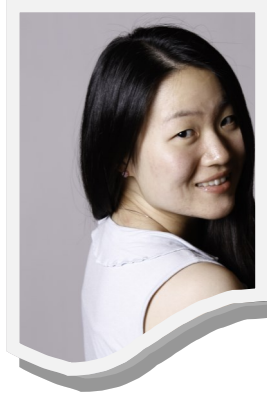
### Regular Program
